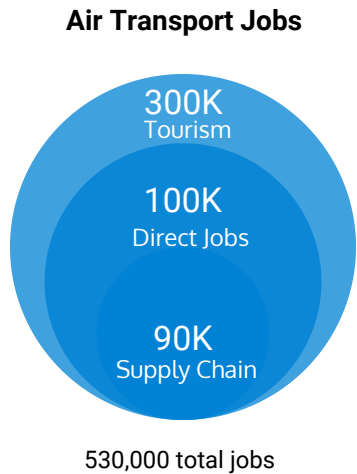
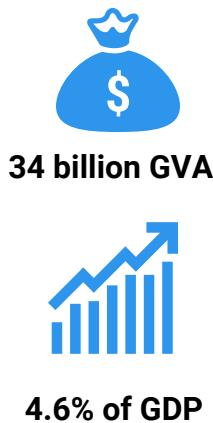
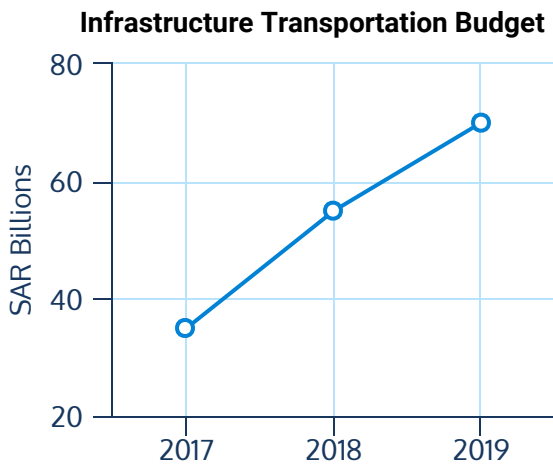


Civil Aviation Industry

The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is a G20 Middle Eastern country located within five hours air transport from half of the world's population. A major transformation is underway to support the country's Vision 2030 to become a global center for transportation, logistics services, and tourism. A network of 27 airports is serviced by 5 national airlines and 105 international airlines and handles over 91 million passengers annually. Saudi Arabia has 64 direct flights to the top 10 fastest growing cities, including Ho Chi Minh City, Lagos, Delhi, and Dhaka, and 28 direct flights to the 10 fastest growing countries, including China, India, Indonesia, the Philippines, Vietnam. The General Authority of Civil Aviation (GACA) governs the civil aviation sector. GACA oversees economic and safety regulation, air navigation services and the operations of Saudi Arabia's network of airports. The authority also manages major developments in passenger transportation, air cargo, airport construction and equipment, air navigation and control in Saudi Arabia. GACA is currently implementing a number of Public Private Partnerships and is looking for a wide range of U.S. suppliers of services and products to expand and modernize the sector.

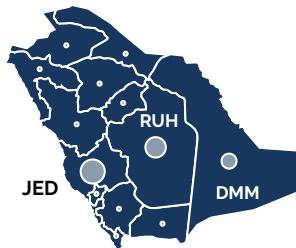


Passenger Traffic

Total Passengers

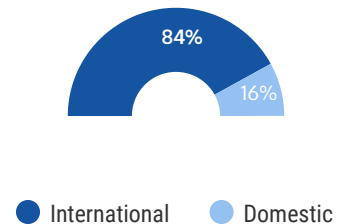


Busiest Airports
